<u>Public Comment:</u> Chair Pearson called for public participation. There was none.		
Chief's Report:		
Chief Smith: Provided a written report in his absence. The Gunderson Road property is still available but we need to

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determine a timeline for purchase which will determine how we proceed. Larry Todd will discuss this with his legal team this week. There will be very little impact to the distrct in regards to the new Arborwood development. All homes will be sprinkled with residential fire protection systems. Once the development is built, it should bring an additional 1.5 million per year in revenue. Chief Smith informed the board that he has spoken with the tribal representative to let him know we are still interested in the property regarding Station 84 and that we will begin to get some preliminary information for the board this spring.

Chief LaGrandeur: Reported the call volume for January 2022 was 277 incidents. Of those, 68% were EMS, and 32% were non-EMS. There were 5 structure fires in January, two of which were in District and three were mutual aid (two to Bainbridge Island and one in Poulsbo). The structure fire in Poulsbo happened during the snow event in early January which Battalion 81 was the incident commander. Poulsbo had two fires going at once. This was a fatality fire. No fire service personnel were injured at any of the fires. We had 109 transports in January, which does not include transports by mutual aid agencies or airlifts. COVID numbers have seen a significant decrease in the last month. Kitsap Public Health District reported 1,266 cases for the week ending on February 5th, 2022. There were 2,322 cases reported for the week ending on January 29th, 2022. Correction to the total call volume for 2021 from 3,340 to 3,360 as there was an issue with one of the reports we use which has now been fixed for accurate reporting. There were 1,102 hours of overtime/comp time earned in January which some will be reimbursed from Port Ludlow Fire and Rescue. Our new paramedic, David Lyons, started on January 24th and is currently working through the process to get checked off by oiur MPD to work as a paramedic in Kitsap County. He will begin the fire academy in March and is preparing for that as well. Our first labor management meetingfor the year was held on February 7th. This was our quarterly meeting that included representatives from the Union, Administration, and the Board of Commissioners. We have two new Union representatives, Justin Slye and Russell Fergus. We hosted two "After the Fire" meetings via Zoom on Tuesday, February 8th. These were for the Maple St. fire on January 21st and the Village Green Apartments fire on January 22nd. Both were well attended and we have received positive feedback from people who were there. Thanks to PIO Laboda for setting these up and running the presentations and to BC Buchanan, who did a nice job explaining our firefighting operations at each event.

Chief Abrigo: Reported that we have started the bidding process for the remodel of the Station 81 unisex bathroom as it has a large leak currently. The capital purchase we made for the new compressor will be here hopefully by the end of this week. We ordered new PPE at the beginning of the month and will arrive within 5 to 6 months. We would like to surplus the old forklift by the end of this month.
