During the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium except for employers that are fire protection districts formed under Title 52 RCW the cost of the minimum benefits as defined in this plan shall be funded on the following ratio: Employer contributions shall be fifty percent and employee contributions shall be fifty percent. It is the intent of the legislature that is policy will be continue in subsequent biennia. Title 52 RCW governs fire protections districts and RFAs, though there is no formal definition of a fire protection district in this section of law. Discussion ensued.
